2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

Contribution:-

IQAC prepares formal teaching plan with the help of Heads of all Departments. This plan is then delivered to teachers and students for implementation.

Teachers are encouraged to make ICT enabled teaching learning. Each teacher is asked to prepare at least three lessons with the use of the ICT. All teachers are given compulsory training in the use of computer.

Students are also informed about the use of computers and internet available in the library where nine computers are placed especially for students.

IQAC suggested teachers and students to set their goal and to try to develop required infrastructure to support the teaching learning process.

All teachers are given D.L., T.A., and registration fees for minimum two Seminars/ workshops/ symposiums in a year.

IQAC insists that every faculty attend minimum two National level Seminars , presents minimum two research papers in two papers in National / International level Seminars and publishes minimum two papers during the academic year in journal with ISSN.

Any student or teacher of the college can purchase / recommend any useful book/s for the college library.

**Monitoring:-**

Periodic assessment of teaching learning process is done by collecting monthly reports from the teaching staff about the coverage of syllabus during that particular month. If required, teachers are advised to overcome the defect. From students' oral / written feedbacks also teachers' performance, completion of syllabi etc. is known.

**Evaluation:-**

Academic evaluation is carried out by the Principal and HODs through the feedback obtained from students. IQAC analyses the feedback taken for follow up actions.

#### 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college is not having the autonomous status; it follows the syllabus framed by Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University. Normally University updates the syllabus of each subject every three years.

Many of our faculty members are serving as a member of the Board of Studies of our University. IQAC delivers suggestions to these faculties based on informal feedbacks and suggestions received from various stakeholders for curriculum Development for course set-up and teaching methodology. They give their suggestions and recommendations in updating the curriculum as per the feedback given by the stakeholders. Our Principal is the Dean of Arts faculty, we can directly send our suggestions to him.

Some teachers who are members of BOS, BUTR, AC and such bodies, contribute directly to curriculum development. Teachers also send their suggestions to University BOS for curricular development and changes in syllabi.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Each department of college makes its lesson planning and academic planning.
- It is ensured that courses are completed in each department.
- Educational tours, Surveys, Visits, Lectures by experts and scholars in various subjects are regularly organized.
- Unit Tests in all departments are arranged; slow learners are indentified and paid attention.
- Class room Seminars for students are integral part of teaching.
- > Research Scholars are given extra facilities in library.
- > Interdisciplinary lectures are organized.
- Regular feedbacks are short from students to enhance the quality of teaching and learning.
- > The college has modern information and communication technology to enrich the teaching and learning experiences of the beneficiaries. The college has an adequate number of computer systems.
- ➤ College follows various methods for teaching and learning. Each core subject combination is supplemented amply by co-curricular and extra-curricular program. Learning with earning encourages the students to plan, probe, verify and experiment on a wide spectrum of issues, dialogue, discussion and debate.
- ➤ The CBCS System is quite challenging. The students were provided proper guidance through counselling to meet the challenges.

The following structure was adopted to obtain better output of teaching and learning.

- > Remedial classes for weak learners
- Motivation for rank holders
- > ICT enabled training and provision for ICT tools
- ➤ Continuous Internal assessment programmes.

- Faculty development program

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Internal Exams as per the norms of the University are arranged regularly.
- For Periodical assessment of the students Unit Tests are arranged.
- Internal Evaluation Results are declared regularly on college notice board and our college website.
- ➤ There is transparency in examination. Students can apply for verification, and reassessment.
- Unit Tests answer books are shown to students.
- > To monitor examination and evaluation work, College has formed Examination committee. The committee arranges examination schedule for both theory and practical. It also communicates all the necessary information regarding internal and external examinations to faculty and student.
- ➤ It arranges all the facilities and manpower for successful organization of examination. It looks after paper drawing, printing, conduction of examination, evaluation and prepares results on time as well as maintains confidentiality of examination process.
- ➤ It also seeks feedbacks from the stakeholders about examinations and evaluation so that required improvements can be implemented if possible.
- > Evaluation process is transparent. Internal evaluation is done throughout semester in the form of internal examinations and assignments. External evaluation is done at the end of semester by HNGU. Results are declared on the internet through HNGU website. Students are allowed to request for rechecking of answer scripts within a stipulated period after announcement of the results. After rechecking records are updated with changes if any and the student are issued a revised mark sheet.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- For research activity there is a Research Committee in College. The Research Committee encourages research. Six Proposals for Minor Research Projects were sent to UGC by teachers. 3 Minor Research Projects are completed.
- > To inculcate research attitude among students, Economic Survey of one village is done every year by the students of economics.
- ➤ 4 students of Psychology presented their research paper on BISAG, Live telecast of educational programmes by Higher Education Department of Gujarat.
- In arts research, mostly books and journals are required so in place of seed money, Books, Journals, Equipment etc. are provided to research scholars.
- > Research scholars are free to buy any books/magazine of their need at college expenses.
- Research journal Nistha with ISSN no. 22780289 is published by college. Research and Development cell is an integral part of the activities of Shri & Smt. P.K.Kotawala Arts College. Patan
- This cell regulates all the academic, sponsored, collaborative research projects and consultancy works in the college. The objective of the Research Cell varies from the advancement of theoretical knowledge to development of new technology to solve practical problems. The current research projects have also acted as the training ground for the young UG-PG students of this college. Research Cell helps teachers in applying for MRP.It also organises research workshops / lectures on research projects. One such lecture of Dr. D.C.Patel was organised by the Cell.
- To cultivate among students a sight for research, students are guided to prepare research papers. Our students of Psychology prepared such paper and presented on BISAG. Our Economics students prepare Economic Survey of a village every year.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The college has a rich library with about 40,000/- books. In the year 2014-15, 633 text books, 50 reference books, and 4 journals were added.
- The library has wi-fi connectivity and 10 computers, 7 for students' use. There is SOUL and INFLIBNET facility in the library.
- ➤ 471 Educational CDs and Videos are available in the library.
- Photocopy facility is available for Students.
- > Reading room facility for students even after college hours is being created and is on the verge of completion.

#### **Physical Infrastructure**

Institute has BISAG seminar Halls equipped with internet and projector with seating capacity of 150-200 people, Teaching Faculty Common room, Administrative Office, Class rooms, Girls common room, DEL LAB, Psychology Laboratory, Library, Internet and Wi-Fi facility is available in the entire building.

#### Library

Library committee suggest a list of books based on interaction with the students and faculty members. This list is forwarded to concerning authority for sanction and after getting approval books are purchased.

Library is enriched with more than 40000 printed book titles,12 journals, more than 471 CDs & videos. The library has N-LIST SOUL software. It has 65 periodicals, newspapers, magazines etc. There are 10 computers with Wi fi connectivity. Seven computers with wifi connectivity are for students' use.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- > Teachers are given enough scope for development in their respective fields/subject.
- They are given permission for further studies on demand.
- > Teachers are given special leave and other facilities for research.
- Required books/ magazines / periodicals, equipments are purchased for staff and research scholars in the College.
- ➤ Teachers are given leaves and D.A. and registration fee for participation in seminars, workshop etc. Last year (2014-15) teachers of our college attended 14 International Level, 65 National Level and 29 State Level Seminars/Workshops.
- ➤ Teachers are sent for Faculty Development Programme, Refresher Courses and Orientation Courses.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment:

- Faculty is recruited as per Government guidelines.
- ➤ The college management also appoints faculty and Non-Teaching staff on ad-hoc basis where regular staffs are not appointed by the government.
- Faculty and staff recruitment is made as per the Government & UGC norms.
- ➤ When the State Govt. delays the NOC process for old/new vacancies as per the work-load, the College Trust, as per Govt. academic qualification recruitment process norms, appoints the Faculty as well as Staff not to let the college work suffer for the benefit of the students.
- This year (2014-15) the college had appointed 17 Non-Teaching and 05 Teaching staff on ad-hoc basis.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- As such there is no direct industry interaction for Arts Colleges .But Call centres and certain BPOs visit the college for recruitment.
- Our students of Psychology are regularly taken for a visit to Kanoriya Center for Medical Education, Gandhinagar every year.
- > Students of History Department visit Historical places every year.
- The Sanskrit and Prakrit department have collaboration with Patan Jain Mandal and Bhartiya Vidyabhavan for studies in ancient manuscripts on Bhojpatra.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

- There is admission committee for students' admissions on the University to guide students.
- The committee is formed as per the norms with SC, ST, OBC representatives in it.
- Admission procedure is totally transparent, based purely on merit as per University rules.
- SC, ST, OBC quota as per rules is maintained.
- > Our college follows the schedule decided by the university of HNGU, Patan which is announced in major newspapers and news channels, and the university website. The college also give publicity to the admission process through the college website, prospectus and notice boards The dates and course details for admission are announced in newspaper. It is also given in College Brochure given with Admission Form.
- An admission committee is formed comprising of faculty and office staff under the chairmanship of the Principal for the process of admission. The process of admission is monitored by admission committee. Transparency is maintained regarding admission to all the candidates of all categories.
- For UG admission the college adheres to all the rules and regulation of Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University and the guideline of Reservation policy prescribed by government.

College organises regular meetings with the support staff. It also organises lectures by experts and sends staff members for training scheduled by Government and by University. Last year (2013-14) a seminar on RTI was organised by our college for support staff.

- The support staff members were given soft skill training, especially of Computer Operative Skills to make the administration smooth, effective, accurate and timesaving for the students and the institute as well.
- One day workshop on leadership and motivation was organized to Create an idea environment which provided the opportunity to share ideas and experiences with other academic issues in a institute.

#### 6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

The entire College Campus is declared "NO Plastic Zone". "Clean Campus, Green Campus is the slogan implemented by all institutes on our Campus. Tree plantation is regularly done by the NSS, NCC students and the students who have joined the NatureClub. Trees/plants are adopted by students and some teachers. Classroom cleanliness activity is done by students occasionally to create cleanliness awareness among them. Debates , essay competitions, are organised for awareness among students.

Initiatives taken by the college to make the campus eco-friendly

- Energy conservation Strict measures in using the electricity and encouraging saving the current attitudes among staff and students.
- Water harvesting—Installed in various places inside the campus and developed water tank in the botanical garden. Rain water is stored.
- Plantation—For making green campus, Staff and students have planted trees in the campus and in the botanical garden. Moreover, NSS and NCC units provide their extension services in the campus and outside of the campus for tree plantation.
- Hazardous waste management Effective housekeeping system is practiced where

One more additional Programme, B.A. in Sociology is also to be started.
